

BMS minimum Windows or Mac laptop specification for Autumn 2022

In the context of university study, the expectation is that as a BMS student, you should be able to access the following basic IT requirements:

1. Access to the internet at your place of residence. If you are staying in University halls this will be included in your charges.
2. We strongly recommend that all incoming BMS students ensure that they bring a suitable laptop computer with them to enable them to make the most of the learning opportunities at BMS throughout the full 5 years of the course. You will need access to a laptop for session preparation, individual and group study, in-class teaching sessions, coursework, and many of your assessments throughout the entire 5-year MBBS. A tablet alone will not be sufficient.

We recommend a **minimum** Windows or Mac specification of:

- *Current i5 CPU (or Apple M1 or M2 series) with:*
 - *Windows 10 or Mac OS 11 or later*
 - *8Gb RAM*
 - *13" screen*
 - *256Gb Hard Drive (SSD)*
 - *Wi-Fi capable*
 - *a Full HD screen as a minimum (1080p)*
 - *built-in webcam (720p minimum) and speakers*
 - *a DVD drive is **not** essential*

Please note:

- Brunel University requires both up-to-date and working Antivirus and Antispyware to be installed and running on all devices connected to the university network¹
- A lower specification may be used but it may **not** prove suitable for all needs
- We **do not** recommend or support Chromebooks
- We **do not** recommend, or support Linux/Unix based systems
- A tablet alone will **not** be sufficient

As a BMS student the university will provide the basic software packages you need for personal use free of charge whilst you remain a student. These include:

- Microsoft Office Microsoft Office365 including OneDrive cloud storage (for Windows, Mac and on your mobile device/smartphone)
- Brightspace Pulse App (iOS & Android) for mobile/smartphone access to the BMS Virtual Learning Environment (VLE)
- Statistics software
